How do we build a church and a society with the marginalised, the excluded and the most vulnerable at its heart? What does 'home' mean for those who are homeless or struggling to keep a roof over their heads, for those who have fled their homes, for those who are rejected or don't fit in? And for the comfortable and secure, is it a space to defend or to open in welcome? Can we recognise that it is only in relationship with each other and with the earth that we share that we can all be truly 'at home'?

### **SPEAKERS**

**Rev Al Barrett** is Rector of Hodge Hill Church, a CofE-URC ecumenical partnership in east Birmingham. He lives on a diverse outer estate on the edge of the city, and has been involved in a journey of community-building there, with friends and neighbours, for the last 7 years. He writes and teaches a bit, blogs irregularly, at [www.thisestate.blogspot.com](http://www.thisestate.blogspot.com), and has recently finished a PhD, seeking to develop a radically receptive political theology in the urban margins'.  
**David McLoughlin** teaches at Newman University. He is a theological resource person for Caritas Europe, CAFOD, Pax Christi, the J&P network and various groups of Religious. He is a founder member of the Movement of Christian Workers and an active member of their Birmingham revue of life group for 30 years. He explores the relationship between theology and everyday life and offers radical readings of the Bible for Christian activists.

**Sarah Teather** has been Director of Jesuit Refugee Service UK since January 2016. She served for 12 years as MP in north west London. She stood down in 2015 and worked with JRS International, visiting refugee projects around the world, before taking up her present post.

**John Grogan MP** a Catholic, was elected in 2017 as Labour MP for Keighley and Ilkley, having previously been MP for Selby before boundary changes abolished the seat. He is committed to issues of social justice and peace, voting against Trident renewal.

1. Bookings are processed in the order they are received.
2. A booking is only accepted on receipt of the appropriate deposit.
3. Every effort is made to provide the type of room requested but, owing to limited accommodation, families with older children may be placed in adjacent rooms.
4. Low Income rate is heavily subsidised and is intended for those who would otherwise be unable to attend.
5. A discount of 10% may be claimed by families including up to 2 adults and children aged 3-18. (No charge for under 3).
6. Conference participants are requested to pay the balance due on their booking by Wednesday 20 June 2018
7. Cancellations after 20 June 2018 will be liable for the basic accommodation costs unless the place can be filled.
8. Non-attenders who have failed to pay in full will also be liable for the basic accommodation costs.
9. **Adult bookings received after 18 May 2018 will be subject to a surcharge of £7.50** (does not apply to Saturday only).
